

Your home plumbing plan

Fill this out before a leak. Keep a copy with your emergency supplies.

1. Know your water shutoff

Home's customer-owned main shutoff location

Approved procedure / person who identified it for us

Where we saved the shutoff photo

Ask a plumber or property manager to identify an unfamiliar valve. Follow your water provider's rules. Never force a stuck valve or pull on meter wires.

2. Keep the right numbers nearby

Water provider / emergency phone

Property manager / after-hours phone, if applicable

Kit location / date last checked

3. Check your basic supplies

Have water alarms? Keep them at the risk locations, not packed in the kit. Follow their placement and testing instructions.

If a leak or backup starts

Stop using the affected fixture. For a supply leak, use an identified shutoff only if you know how and can reach it safely. Closing the supply does not clear a drain blockage. Keep people and pets away from sewage, wet electrical equipment, and damaged ceilings. Call for help if the valve is stuck or you cannot safely identify the problem.
